WHEREAS, the Board is experiencing financial distress and declining enrollment; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that it does not have the resources to provide its students with a thorough and efficient education during the 2020-2021 school year and the foreseeable future; and **WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 18A:38-8 authorizes any board of education to enter into a sending-receiving relationship with another district whereby it sends its pupils to the receiving district's schools for one grade or more in exchange for tuition payment; and

WHEREAS, the Little Egg Harbor Township School District operates a prekindergarten through sixth grade school district; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to explore appropriate alternatives for educating its students, the Board retained Southern Regional Institute & Educational Technology Training Center ("SRI & ETTC") of Stockton University for the purpose of conducting a feasibility study on entering into a sending-receiving relationship with the Little Egg Harbor Board of Education ("Little Egg Harbor"); and

WHEREAS, the results of the feasibility study indicated that the Board's prekindergarten through sixth grade students could receive a thorough and efficient education at Little Egg Harbor; and;

WHEREAS, at the Board's March 3, 2020 special meeting, the Board accepted the feasibility study conducted by SRI & ETTC; and

WHEREAS, Little Egg Harbor has expressed a desire to enter into a send-receive agreement with the Board in which it will educate the Board's prekindergarten through sixth grade school district on a tuition basis; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to enter into a sending-receiving agreement with Little Egg Harbor to send its prekindergarten through sixth grade students to Little Egg Harbor beginning in the 2020-2021 school year.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board has determined that its prekindergarten through sixth grade students can receive a thorough and efficient education at Little Egg Harbor; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board will enter into an appropriate sending-receiving agreement whereby Little Egg Harbor will receive the Board's prekindergarten through sixth grade students beginning in the 2020-2021 school year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board authorizes its legal counsel to prepare and negotiate a sending-receiving agreement with Little Egg Harbor.
